Grant Application

Letter of Intent

A letter of intent is required before receiving an invitation to submit a grant application. If funding is available, and In the Family Way finds the request within the scope of our mission, you will receive an invitation to submit an application.

The Letter of Intent should be a maximum of 2,000 characters describing the practitioner(s) and the project for which funding is requested, including the budget. Applicants may include weblinks if available for image files or additional information. Our grants range in amount. The current maximum is generally \$1,500.

Application Guidelines

We accept proposals across genres & media. Preference is given to projects dedicated to harnessing the transformative capacity of art and creativity. Projects that engage collective creativity and use art for education, healing, and growth are encouraged.

Preference will be given to projects that intend to cultivate systemic change through a focus on local communities or issues where a project's contribution may have the capacity for catalytic impact. We encourage applications for projects that arise from and serve historically marginalized or under-represented cultures and communities.

Review Process

Letters of intent are received and reviewed on a first come first served basis throughout the year. Funding decisions are made by the Board of Directors during regular meetings. Applicants will be notified as to the status of their proposals within 8 weeks.

Grants are paid upon signing a grant contract that outlines the payout of funds, timeline for project completion, and required reporting based on our fiscal year, which ends December 31.
